### About the Course

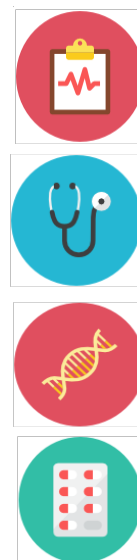
This short course, put together by the Program on Global Health and Human Rights at the University of Southern California, is designed as an open access, free online resource. The course is designed to boost literacy and support action to address the links between Non Communicable Diseases (NCDs) and human rights (HRs). We hope it will be useful to advocacy groups, researchers, policy makers, practitioners, students and everyone interested in exploring and addressing the links between HRs and NCDs.

### Course Structure

The course is divided into seven sessions and includes lectures, background documents, and resources.

- Session 1: NCD Basics
- Session 2: HRs in Relation to NCD Prevention & Control
- Session 3: Potential Approaches to Using HRs in NCD Prevention & Control
- Session 4: Operationalizing the Linkages between NCD and HRs-Entry Points for Engagement
- Session 5: Translating HRs Principles from the HIV Epidemic to NCDs
- Session 6: Breastfeeding and Baby Formulas: A Question of Health and HRs
- Session 7: Conclusion

The course sessions can be accessed sequentially or in any order most convenient to your work. Lecturers include Professors Laura Ferguson and Sofia Gruskin (USC), David Patterson (International Development Law Organization), and Marcus Stahlhofer (World Health Organization).
